Summary of Responsibilities: The Studio Arts Department seeks a candidate for fulltime faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor – Printmaking and Foundations. The ideal candidate will be an artist with an active artistic practice and have at least two years of teaching experience at the college or university level. Candidates will teach all levels of undergraduate printmaking, covering low-toxic alternatives to the classic processes and fundamental art courses with an emphasis on contemporary media and Indigenous arts and theory. The candidate will participate in the development of Studio Arts department curriculum and assessment of student learning, as well as perform the duties, responsibilities, and requirements of the position that support IAIA's mission, vision, and core values. As a member of the community the faculty will also provide service as a mentor and advisor to assigned students. In line with its enabling federal legislation, IAIA extends preference to Natives in employment.

Essential Functions:

- Teach three courses per semester in multiple formats (on-line, hybrid, in person).
- Maintain a high level of expertise in the content being taught.
- Create and execute meaningful lessons to work towards the department learning outcomes.
- Ensure classes are held as scheduled by the college.
- Participate in program curriculum development and appointed committees
- file appropriate course syllabus in canvas for each course taught.
- Serve as academic advisor to assigned students.
- Keep appropriate number of office hours per week.
- Demonstrate competency in use of campus-provided technology and software supporting instruction and campus collaboration.
- Participate in designated college ceremonies, meetings, mandatory training, professional development, and convocations.
- Participate in faculty evaluation process.
- Willing to serve as rotational chair of department.
- adhere to appropriate standards of conduct and ethics which include but is not limited to
 - Confidentiality
 - Integrity and honesty
 - o Cooperate collaborate and always treat others with dignity
 - o participate proactively in problem solving.
- Maintain and upkeep equipment in the Printmaking studio

Required Education:

- MFA in Studio Arts with a Printmaking focus or equivalent graduate degree in related field, or the
 equivalent combination of education and professional experience. MFA in progress with significant record
 of professional artistic achievement.
- Active artistic practice and exhibition record.
- 2 years of full-time teaching experience at the undergraduate level.
- Must complete a satisfactory background check.
- Knowledge of health, safety and waste management for the printmaking studio and ability to teach and maintain the studio to standards.

Working conditions

- Ability to instruct for extended periods of time in a classroom environment.
- Effective communication skills both written and spoken should be clear, respectful, and considerate towards the IAIA community
- Ability to identify and review a wide range of relevant academic information.
- Ability to critically and constructively contribute to an ever-evolving Studio Arts Program
- Exhibit the ability and flexibility to adapt to a dynamic and changing work environment
- May be asked by Department Chair/Academic Dean to perform other duties.
